State Sales Tax Increase On May 2015 Ballot



The Lame Duck State Government voted to ask the voters if they want to raise the sales tax from 6% to 7% (a 16.7% increase). This is supposed to fix our roads. It will be on the May ballot. Are you in favor of raising our sales tax? If not are you going to do something about it?
